Celebrating the achievements of SA Breeders, Toorak Thoroughbred Breeding Trust, Mr Harry Perks, Guru Breeding Syndicate, Trainer Mr Andrew Gluyas and Mill Park Stud.

Seventeen years ago, Andrew Gluyas played a pivotal role in his future father-in-law Leon Macdonald's triumph with Rebel Raider in the Victoria Derby, witnessing the victory from Morphettville as Macdonald celebrated.

On Saturday, November 2nd, Gluyas stepped into the limelight, claiming his first Victoria Derby win with Goldrush Guru (American Pharoah), a fitting homage to the legacy that continued after Leon's retirement last year, marking the end of their training partnership. Goldrush Guru's victory contributes to a rich lineage of accomplishments that has evolved over decades. Harry Perks, who has bred notable winners such as Caulfield Cup BRED champion Southern Speed and ATC Derby victor Gold Guru, also bred the 2008 Victoria Derby surprise Rebel Raider, as well as the 2019 winner Warning. Rebel Raider was ridden by Clare Lindop, making her the first female jockey to win this classic event, Jamie Kah became just the second to achieve this honour with her expertly timed ride.

Harry recently celebrated success on Melbourne Cup Day with Air Assault, who won at Morphettville. This talented gelding, Group I placed last season in the SA Derby, continued the winning streak for Victoria Derby champion Andrew Gluyas by securing the Listed SAIC John Letts Cup (1800m) at Morphettville on Melbourne Cup Day. Ridden by Jason Holder, the son of Justify (USA) surged ahead to win by two lengths, bringing his record to seven wins, one second, and four thirds from 22 starts, with earnings exceeding \$642,000. All abovementioned horses have been raised at Mill Park Stud, Meningie, SA by the Watson family.

Worthy of mention, however not strictly SA Bred but singing the praises of our local farms, fourth placed Kingofwallstreet was a graduate of SA's Rathmore Lodge and was sold though the Adelaide MM sale. The Matt Cumani trained 3yo had won at G3 level the start prior to his Victoria Derby 4th.

Praises are being sung for SA breeders Andrew & Jody Nitschke from Millicent, the proud breeders of recent Flemington Carnival Stakes winner **Rey Magnerio**.

Rey Magnerio by Magnus out of Testa Rosa mare Luchardo was sold out of the paddock as a late 2yo, via astute bloodstock agent Peter Ford to the Cranbourne based training team of Robbie Griffiths and Matt De Kock.

Andrew & Jody purchased Luchardo online for only \$1,000 back in 2016 with Ray Magnerio being the best of her progeny thus far amassing earnings to date of \$647,500.

TBA CEO Writes Open Letter to Breeders

Tom Reilly, the chief executive of Thoroughbred Breeders Australia, has penned an open letter to Australia's thoroughbred industry following what appeared to be a rushed decision to announce Group 1 status for The Everest and the All-Star Mile. Here, in full, is what he wrote:

"I am writing to you about an issue that I know is causing significant consternation in the breeding industry, namely the recent announcements around the Pattern. Earlier this month Racing Australia said it had agreed new Black Type Guidelines, at a similar time it was stated the Everest and the All Star Mile would now have Group 1 status. Neither Thoroughbred Breeders Australia (TBA) or Aushorse, nor any of the State breeding bodies were briefed on these Guidelines before they were agreed to at Racing Australia. Since the announcement of the Guidelines, TBA has been engaged in a lot of dialogue and discussion with racing administrators here in Australia, as well as representatives that sit on international committees such as the International Grading and Race Planning Advisory Committee (IRPAC), the Society of International Thoroughbred Auctioneers (SITA) and the Asian Pattern Committee (APC). Although we have yet to see the full Guidelines, from briefings we have received from racing authorities and details that have emerged in the media, we have raised a number of concerns, including:

- The lack of a broader group including breeders and the sales companies in decision making.
- Races to be awarded or retain Group and Listed status purely based on ratings.
- The average rating for a race to be calculated using the winner's rating plus three of the next four finishers (with the presumed intention of dropping the lowest rated horse from calculations).
- A moratorium on downgrades for two years.

It is the view of TBA that Australia needs a Pattern system that is both robust and transparent and involves a broader group of stakeholders involved in decision-making than just racing administrators. It is also vital that our Black Type is recognised around the world. These recent Guidelines were developed in an effort to end the impasse over the Pattern, which had seen no races upgraded or downgraded for seven years. They were also shaped by concerns over Australian competition law. TBA has engaged a specialist competition lawyer to assist us in pulling together an alternate framework for decision-making in relation to the Pattern. We will continue to work with racing authorities and other interested parties and are hopeful we can resolve this issue as a matter of urgency."
